Here's what Catherine Washburn Medical Association (CWMA) has been doing for 50+ years to keep quality healthcare available in our rural setting:

- Since 1971, we've provided the land and building for our Lopez Clinic, including expanding, remodeling, and ongoing maintenance. CWMA pays for much of our clinic's equipment, including a stateof-the-art X-ray machine in 2022.
- Since 2017, we have financially supported Lopez Island Physical Therapy as they formed a new legal entity and moved into new office space.
- During the COVID pandemic, we purchased a vaccine refrigerator/freezer and paid for material for masks made by volunteers as well as RNs license renewal fees.
- We maintain a fund so all people on Lopez can afford healthcare.
- We've provided equipment for Lopez Fire and EMS.
- We're committed to assisting Lopez Pharmacy in its transition to new owners (in progress).

#### **Our Clinic Is a Top Performer in Patient Experience Survey!**

UW Medicine recently recognized our clinic for receiving a top score in our patient experience survey. The survey measures how well our staff worked together to care for our patients. For the first quarter of this fiscal year, our clinic score was 96.98. This is a 95th percentile rank compared to national peers! Many thanks to our patients for completing the survey. With a heavy heart, we want to let you know Wen Murphy, ARNP, FNP-BC, has accepted a new telemedicine position with UW Medicine and will leave her practice at our clinic as of June 16. Recruiting a new provider is a priority for UW Medicine Primary Care, and we will reach out soon to Wen's patients about a plan for continuity of care.

## Do You Know Where to Go for Care?

Here's a guide to our in-clinic services and others you might seek elsewhere. You can see us for Behavioral Health, Chronic Disease Management, EKGs, Lab testing (aside from some delicate specialty labs), Primary Care – including preventive care such as Wellness Visits and Well-Child checkups, Sutures, Urgent Care/Acute Care/Same Day appointments where appropriate, Vaccinations, Wound Care, and X-Ray Imaging (No CT/No Ultrasound).

We do not provide advanced imaging, pregnancy care beyond confirmation, or specialty care. Although we coordinate with Lopez Island EMS to stabilize patients requiring Emergency Room (ER) care, we are not an ER. Patients needing an ER will be transported via Ferry or Air Transport when appropriate.
